

Russian authorities confirm that 45 border-crossing points will accept TIR carnets

The Russian authorities have just published the Order Nr. 2568 of the Federal Customs Service, dated 14 December 2015, on “transporting goods in accordance with the Customs Convention on the International Transport of Goods under Cover of TIR Carnets».

This order, which is enclosed in Russian language, was formally registered by the Russian Ministry of Justice on 18 December 2015 (ref, Nr. 40161).

According to this order, which will formally enter into force within 30 days, the admission of goods under TIR through the Russian territory will be possible at 45 border-crossing points. This latest list includes additional important border-crossing points with Russia’s major trade partners, after numerous consultations within Russian competent authorities and with the private sector.

Transport operators are recommended to use TIR Carnets when performing their transit operations in Russia through the border crossing points listed in annex to this order (also enclosed in English and in Russian).

As this development is very recent and as the order is not yet officially in force, some problems at various border crossing points cannot be excluded over the next few days.

The IRU will keep monitoring developments very closely and will provide further information as it becomes available.
